FREE WORKSHOPS & EVENTS

Various free, open-to-the-public events throughout the year raise awareness of the arts. Think you can't do something, like draw, dance, or write songs? Energize a dormant part of your brain by trying something new at the "I Can't" workshop series. These lunchtime workshops are designed to be an enjoyable diversion from the daily grind and occur during the fall and spring semesters.

Throughout the year, the Event Hall displays art exhibitions by local and national artists and community organizations. Artists hold free lectures and/or workshops to share their inspiration and talents with the community and TCC students. TCC faculty exhibit their paintings, drawings, jewelry and 3D pieces in the annual Faculty Art Show, and TCC students and faculty sell original artwork directly to the public at the biannual art sale.

The Center for Creativity also hosts diverse learning experiences. The Provost's Lecture Series provides opportunities to hear from renowned scholars, and the TCC Die Laughing improv troupe performs hilarious live comedy. Aspiring and established entrepreneurs can take advantage of a variety of educational and networking opportunities at the Center. FACILITY RENTALS

The Thomas K. McKeon Center for Creativity Event Hall, conference room, and integrated outdoor spaces are available to external groups on a limited basis and upon approval of the Dean. Priority is given to events that are free and open to the public with an emphasis on art, design, communication, education and/or creativity. Nonprofit rates are available.

- The Event Hall features a large HD screen, professional lighting and sound, and an adjacent holding kitchen.
- The Boston Avenue Terrace is a covered outdoor space that overlooks the TCC Main Academic Building.
- The Third Floor Observation Deck offers striking views of downtown Tulsa.
- The Collaboration Courtyard features Oklahoma's first green rooftop.

THE CREATIVITY CHANNEL

The Creativity Channel connects our diverse community through innovative programming that inspires academic, cultural, and social curiosity. Original programming airs on Cox Cable channel 21 and streams on the Tulsa Community College YouTube channel.

Productions highlight TCC students, faculty and the community, delivering the arts and Tulsa's rich culture to audiences locally and globally. Ongoing programs include:

- "Temas en Tulsa" provides programming for the growing Latino community in Oklahoma.
- "Oklahoma Up Close" highlights Oklahomans who have made notable accomplishments that reach beyond state lines.
- "Creative Conversations" features Tulsa's artistic and cultural organizations.
- "Diversity Dialogue" strengthens TCC's connection with the African American community's history and culture.

ACADEMICS

The Center for Creativity offers students hands-on experience in a real-world learning environment. All classrooms and labs feature iMac computers, and students train on state-of-the-art equipment, including:

- an HD television studio
- four HD Final Cut digital edit suites
- two digital audio capture booths

Art studios offer an abundance of natural light, panoramic views of the city, and enhanced ventilation systems. Radio and broadcast students get hands-on experience in the digital radio lab and run The Grid, TCC's student-driven internet radio station.
