On Monday, July 10, 2017 at 10:00 a.m., requests for qualifications were received from fourteen (14) construction manager firms per request for qualification for the remodel of the Student Success Center at the Southeast Campus.

After careful consideration and evaluation of the qualifications in accordance with Oklahoma Statute Title 61 and 652, it is the recommendation of the Facilities Committee that the preconstruction costs of \$20,610 and the construction manager fee of 3.5% from Crossland Construction Company, Inc., 14149 E. Admiral Place, Tulsa, OK 74116, be accepted.

STUDENT IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

REQUIREMENT FOR DOCUMENTION OF VACCINATIONS AND TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING HEPATITIS B, MEASLES, MUMPS, AND RUBELLA.

This policy is to fulfill Board of Regents requirement as directed in Oklahoma Statute Title 70 Chapter 50 Article II Section 3244.

In order to enroll as a full-time or part-time student at Tulsa Community College, an individual shall provide verification of vaccinations against hepatitis B, measles, mumps and rubella.

Tulsa Community College shall make available to students of the vaccination requirements and educational materials. Informational materials will include information on hepatitis B, measles, mumps and rubella. Such information shall include the risks and benefits of the vaccinations against hepatitis B, measles, mumps and rubella.

A student may be exempt from the requirement if they provide the following information, or they only enroll in courses delivered via the Internet or distance learning in which the student is not required to attend class on campus.

- A written statement from a licensed physician indicating that a vaccine is medically contraindicated shall exempt a student from the vaccination.
- A student shall be exempt from the vaccination if the student submits a written, signed statement declaring that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the student's moral or religious tenets or, if the student is a minor, the student's parent or guardian provides a written statement that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the parent's or guardian's moral or religious tenets.

The Board of Regents, in its discretion, includes exceptions to the requirement for written documentation of vaccinations for each of the following categories of students.

- Students that have been admitted to and attended a public, private, or parochial school in Oklahoma and have complied with the immunization requirements included in Section 1210.191 of Title 70 of Oklahoma Statues and any applicable State Board of Health Rule;
- Students that have graduated from high school in a state that requires vaccinations for hepatitis B, measles, mumps and rubella;
- Students transferring from an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a private institution of higher learning located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
- Students born before January 1, 1956; and

• Students who are currently on active duty serving in a branch of the United States military.

Tulsa Community College is not required to provide or pay for vaccinations.

3212 Student Vaccination Requirements

In compliance with state law, Tulsa Community College shall provide students with educational information on the hepatitis B and the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccinations upon enrollment. Such information shall include the risks and benefits of the vaccination. Tulsa Community College shall not be required to provide or pay for vaccinations against hepatitis B, measles, mumps and rubella (MMR). Compliance with Oklahoma law may be achieved by the student (or parent, in the case of a minor) either receiving the vaccinations, affirming that he/she chooses not to be vaccinated due to moral or religious tenets, or affirming their exempt status.

The Board of Regents delegates to the President and CEO of the College or his/her designee representative the authority to exempt the following groups of students:

- The student completes the appropriate TCC form declaring that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the student's moral or religious tenets, or
- The student is a minor and their parent or guardian completes the appropriate TCC form declaring that the administration of the vaccine conflicts with the parent or guardian's moral or religious tenets, or
- The student provides a written statement from a licensed physician indicating that a vaccine is medically contraindicated, or
- The student graduated in 1996 or later from an Oklahoma high school, or
- The student was born before 1957, or
- The student is transferring from an Oklahoma higher education institution, or
- The student is enrolling only in distance education course(s), or
- The student is non-degree seeking, or
- The student is on active military duty or a member of the reserve.

The Board of Regents delegates to the President and CEO of the College or his/her designated representative the authority to exempt other groups of students not listed here providing such exemptions do not compromise the health and safety of the campus environment.

1. Renewal of Employee Group Medical Insurance

On December 31, 2017, Tulsa Community College Medical insurance contract with Aetna will end. A renewal is needed to continue offering medical insurance to the College's full-time employees. The Finance Committee requests authorization to continue the contract with Aetna to provide four medical insurance options January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018.

Based on NFP Broker negotiations, the College will see an increase in premium costs. The increase will be 12.54% which is comparable to industry standards and potential increases in EGID's 2018 premiums and below the AHCA predictions for the state of Oklahoma of 20%.




